**PUBLIC POLICY** By Debbie Nicholas

This month, on August 26, 2020, we honor the Centennial of the ratification of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment! Three noteworthy Nevada suffragists include:

- Hellen Ann (McKenzie) Lovelock Bonnifield, Winnemucca: Organized the state's first suffrage convention. She was President of the Humboldt County Equal Suffrage League.
- Anne Martin, Reno: As President of Nevada Woman's Civic League, led successful state suffrage campaign in 1914. First chairman of NWP in 1916. Ran for US Senate 1918. Picketed White House in 1917, sentenced to 60 days in prison, pardoned after three days.
- Annie Martin, Reno: Legislative chairman for Congressional Union and NWP, member of NWP executive committee, vice chairman of NWP.

Take some time this month to celebrate how far we've come, and practice gratitude to all those who valiantly fought for our right to VOTE! You can continue to support their sacrifices by registering to vote if you have not done so, checking your voter registration status with your local registrars' website, voting in all elections, and supporting voting rights! Some General Information regarding National AAUW Public Policy Focus Areas: Based on the National Board's 2018 Strategic Plan for AAUW, national public policy priorities are focused first on our major areas of focus: education and training, economic security, and leadership. Additional policy priorities are also critical to ensure equity for all. AAUW supports a strong system of public education that promotes gender fairness, equity, diversity and inclusivity, and to address the barriers and implicit biases that hinder the advancement of women and girls. Some of the actions to support these goals include: the enforcement of Title IX and other civil rights laws pertaining to education, increased support & protection of programs meeting the needs of girls and women in all levels of education (especially STEM education), support and access to affordable higher education for women & disadvantaged populations, pay equity and fair compensation and benefits, strengthening retirement benefits and programs, access to a full range of health care services & patient rights, enforcement & full access to civil and constitutional rights, freedom from fear of violence, support of human rights, and ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment.

AAUW materials can be used use to educate your members and the community about the election issues. The <u>2020 Voter Issue Guide</u> provides nonpartisan information about the policy concerns that are critical to women and their families. While AAUW is nonpartisan and does not endorse candidates, it is important to know where candidates stand before you cast your vote.

Many students are registered to vote at their campus address. If they will not be returning to campus this fall or will be leaving campus before Nov 3, they should change their registration back to their home address.


Boulder City Branch Dr. Valerie Jean McNay

She was impressed by the long history of AAUW's efforts to advocate for women in higher education and the funding AAUW provided to Maria Curie for her radiation research.

After relocating to Boulder City, NV in 1994, Valerie learned of the AAUW Branch in the community and has been a member ever since. She appreciates the historical significance of the Boulder City Branch because it is related to the construction of Hoover Dam. Reportedly, the engineers and other managers, hired to build the Dam in the 30's, came from the East and Midwest, bringing their educated spouses, who supposedly had been home economics majors. It was these women who joined together to form an AAUW branch in a rural community with no institution of high education in the area at the time.


